Annualized weighted sales are also expressed on a constant currency basis, which is a measure of sales that provides greater comparability across reporting periods by excluding the impact of exchange rate fluctuations from the translation of functional currencies to the Canadian dollar. 



## United States Total Annualized Weighted Sales (USD millions)




Total U.S. annualized weighted sales were \$86.6 million, a 21.2% decrease over the prior year driven by inflationary pressures on the middle market household and rising mortgage interest rates.

Total Canada annualized weighted sales were \$48.3 million, a 17.3% decrease over the prior year, driven by lower sales of Term and Critical Illness products and consistent with the industry where life insurance applications were down year over year.

## United Kingdom Total Annualized Weighted Sales (GBP millions)




Total U.K. annualized weighted sales were £99.6 million, an 11.5% increase over the prior year. Sales continued to benefit from online and other direct channels during the year which made up 46.3% of total sales.


#### **Total Premiums**

Total gross life insurance premiums were nearly \$1.3 billion, an 8.3% increase over the prior year driven by the U.S. in force growth.


### Certificates and Contracts in Force (thousands)



At December 31, 2022, Foresters Financial had 2.7 million certificates and contracts in force. The increase in 2020 was due to the acquisition of the Halifax Child Trust Funds in the U.K. and the resulting decrease in 2022 was due to the maturing Child Trust Funds.


#### **Total Comprehensive Income**

Total comprehensive income was \$116.1 million in 2022 driven by favorable market-related impacts offset by changes in assumptions relating to mortality and lapse rates.

The consolidated surplus was \$2.09 billion at the end of 2022 as Foresters Financial's capital remains strong with a LICAT ratio of 165.6%, well above the Canadian life insurer average of 129% at December 31, 2022.1

#### **Notes to the Summary Financial Statements**

#### 1. Basis of Presentation of the Summary Financial Statements

The summary consolidated statement of financial position and summary consolidated statement of comprehensive income (loss) have been summarized from The Independent Order of Foresters (Foresters Financial) consolidated financial statements, which are prepared in accordance with International Financial Reporting Standards to portray in summarized form the financial position and results of operations of Foresters Financial. The criteria applied by management in the preparation of these summary financial statements are as follows:

- a) the information in the summary consolidated financial statements is in agreement with the related information in the audited financial statements; and
- b) summary consolidated statements of changes in equity, cash flows, significant
  accounting policies and other explanatory information have not been presented,
  as the relevant information can be obtained from the audited financial statements.

The summary statement of financial position and summary consolidated statement of comprehensive income (loss) are only a summary of the information in Foresters Financial consolidated financial statements for the year ended December 31, 2022. They do not contain sufficient information to allow as full an understanding of the results and state of affairs of Foresters Financial as would be provided by the full consolidated financial statements for the year ended December 31, 2022.

#### 2. Basis of measurement

Foresters Financial consolidated financial statements have been prepared on the historical cost basis except for the following material items in the statement of financial position:

- Financial assets at fair value through profit or loss, available-for-sale financial assets and derivative financial instruments are measured at fair value;
- Employee benefit assets and obligations represent the funded status of these plans which is calculated as the difference between plan assets at fair value and the present value of defined benefit obligations;
- Reinsurance assets and Insurance contract liabilities are calculated using the Canadian Asset Liability Method ("CALM") which is based on accepted actuarial practices according to standards established by the Canadian Institute of Actuaries and the requirements of the Office of the Superintendent of Financial Institutions Canada. This method involves the projection of future events in order to determine the amount of assets that must be set aside currently to provide for all future obligations, including the provision of fraternal benefits, and involves a significant amount of judgment;
- Land and buildings are measured at fair value; and
- Right-of-use assets comprise the amount of lease liability and lease liabilities are measured at the present value of the lease payments.

Goodwill is initially measured as the excess of the purchase price of an acquisition of a subsidiary over the fair value of net identifiable assets acquired. After initial recognition, goodwill is carried at cost less any accumulated impairment losses, which are assessed annually. The initial cost of intangible assets acquired in a business combination is fair value at the date of acquisition. After the date of acquisition, these intangibles are carried at cost less accumulated amortization and impairment losses, which are tested when indicators are present and annually for indefinite life intangibles.

#### 3. Foreign Currency

The functional currencies of the foreign subsidiaries and branch operations have been translated into Canadian dollars. All assets and liabilities are translated at the closing exchange rate at the balance sheet date, and the income and expenses are translated using the average exchange rate for the year. The accumulated gains or losses arising from translation are presented separately in the currency translation accounts, a separate component of accumulated other comprehensive income ("AOCI").
